Hello Everyone

First, I'd like to tell you about my amazing cruise to South America. Well, actually, it wasn't that South America was all that amazing, but, we spent 10 days on the Amazon River. I'll never forget it. The vastness of the river and jungle is enough to hold you in awe – but, the thing that I'll never forget is the people who live in the jungle.

Yep, I said that – people live in the jungle. They live in wooden box houses built on stilts with absolutely no supporting infrastructure. We visited one such residence – the woman who owns it was so proud to show it off. At least 8 people live in this 5-room “house.” (I'm calling it a house because I don't know what else to call it.) The **only** furniture in the whole place was one cot, one chest of drawers and one camper-type stove – for 8 people!

The residents have to travel 2-5 days, by boat, to purchase supplies. The boats offer transportation – but, that's all. The people have to bring their own hammocks and food for the trip.

Try to get your brain around that one. Try to imagine that anyone of us could have been born in the Amazon Jungle – we had no control over that one. The other day, my electricity went off for about 10 minutes. It caused me to think about the Amazon jungle people.

I share this with you for those times that you feel inconvenienced – think about the Amazon Jungle people.

OK ... back to Steeplechase.

I wasn't here ... but, I know the toter process was a total mess. In Valerie Wolfe's words – a “disaster.” Special special THANK YOU to Valerie for all that she did to try to make things run smoothly. Every time she asked for information, so that we could pass it along, she got a different answer. The Jefferson Foundation is providing support for languages. The police will have cards with flags on them. The Cool Springs gas station is now proposed to be on the road entering Cool Springs across from Lowes. It will be part way up the hill at the bend. It is proposed to be a special gas station with a casual restaurant where people can have coffee and hang out.

Council requested the borough engineer investigate why the last remaining roads in Steeplechase have not been turned over to the borough. He met with Dan Caste and Mr. Caste reported that the last things he has to do should be completed by mid May.

There is a lot of new construction for senior citizens in Whitehall. It includes the building on Clairton Blvd., the one on McRoberts and the memory care facility on Provost Rd.

The trash can turmoil seems to be subsiding. Mr. Leventry reported that all of the 35 gal containers had been given out and there is a waiting list. The containers have to be purchased in lots of 112. Council authorized the purchase of 112 more. He reminded residents that they are entitled to **ONE FREE SWAP**. There is a fee for any swaps after that.

The library announced that the Community Read book is **THE GOOD NEIGHBOR** by Maxwell King. He will be at the library on May 21st at 7pm to speak and sign books.

August 24 is Community Day. A lot of activities are being planned for this year.

As our community birthday approaches, we thought you'd like to learn about the history of Steeplechase and how we got here!

STEEPLECHASE HISTORY

In the mid 1990's, Mr. Dick Hanna (deceased), husband of Joyce Hanna, Duncan Lane, researched the history of Steeplechase and shared it with all of us. The content of this article is based primarily on the work done by Mr. Hanna.

Our story begins approximately 44 years ago when a number of businessmen and Community leaders, including Mr. Felix Caste, grandfather of Dan Caste, got together and started working on a proposal to construct a hospital on the land that is now Steeplechase.

In 1969, St. Joseph's Hospital on the South Side called a meeting of the Brentwood-Whitehall Chamber of Commerce to discuss its need to either expand its facilities or cease operations. The hospital had purchased the land which is now Steeplechase for \$500,000 and estimated at \$12 million they could build a hospital and adjacent medical building on the property.

Planning began with architects doing site drawings; discussions with Whitehall Planning Commission and Borough Council concerning zoning approvals – all with the goal of breaking ground in mid-1972. Interestingly, while this was progressing, Homestead Hospital was also looking to relocate and expand its facilities.

In the end, Homestead Hospital was successful in developing what is now Jefferson Hospital and Medical Center. Mr. Felix Caste purchased the land from St. Joseph's Hospital and proceeded to submit plans to Whitehall for a housing complex.

Construction began in 1984 with the first two buildings at the intersection of Lantern Hill and Hennig and the third and fourth buildings on the other two corners of the same intersection.

Design differences are obvious as different builders became involved over the years. You can see these differences as you drive around the Community. For example, approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way up Hennig, the common driveways give way to individual driveways; the three-story townhomes became more one-floor living with second floor bedrooms.

From 1985 to 1990 the Community continued to develop up Hennig Drive, with Mr. Caste selling some of the property to Heartland Homes. In 1996, J.S. Construction came to Steeplechase and built #76-86 Hennig (on the even side). Hennig Drive was completed around 1997. Construction continued along Upper Duncan Lane, Paddock Lane and Belmont Lane. When completed, that brought an end to Phase 1 construction.

J.S. Construction started Phase 2 around 2000 clearing and grading lower Duncan Lane. The homes on Duncan were built in random order depending on if the whole unit of 4-6 homes was sold. Phase 2 was completed 2004-2005.

Phase 3 (2005-2006) saw Caste Drive extended one block further with 9 additional homes and then Parkside Lane was added and connected back to lower Duncan Lane.

Phase 4 started with the odd numbered homes on Steeplechase Court. Then on October 1, 2009, an approved Amendment to the Developer's Agreement was presented to the Whitehall Borough Planning Commission for the continuation of Phase 4, which would include more buildings (approximately 85) on Steeplechase Court and Lantern Hill Ext. Phase 4 was completed when Lantern Hill Ext. opened onto Lantern Hill just off Hennig Drive.

As the building progressed, first, Heartland Homes then Ryan Homes acquired the land from Dan Caste and were in charge of construction. Again as you drive around you will see a variety of home styles that were built.

Finally, in 2018, Dan Caste executed and filed a Quit Claim Deed giving Steeplechase all of the remaining parcels of land that were still owned by Caste. At the date of this article, we are still waiting for Caste to complete required maintenance on the Detention Pond (currently expected the spring of this year), and to complete requirements issued by Whitehall before the Borough will assume responsibility for the sewage systems and roads that have not yet been dedicated.

Let's not forget "Whitehall Park"! In May 1996, Whitehall Borough purchased five acres of land from Caste Development Company. This land abuts Steeplechase at the end of Lantern Hill and along the south end of Parkside Drive and is destined to become a park (in the location of all the trees) sometime in the future.

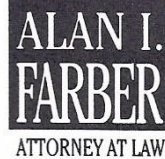
