The Steeplechase website has recently been updated. In the <u>Documents</u> section, the Steeplechase Community Service Association *Rules, Regulations, Policies and Specifications* has been updated and revised. For example, if you select "Exterior Paint Colors", you will be taken directly to the section that lists all the exterior color specifications for shingles, siding, doors and trim colors for your specific building. The Steeplechase Hotline is staffed by resident volunteers. You can call the hotline 24/7 and leave your message. The hotline volunteer will return your call within 24 hours.

To access the Steeplechase Hotline, call the Community Management Professionals (CMP) main number **412-279-9280**, and when prompted to enter your party's extension, you will enter **142**. You will be greeted by a recorded message asking you to leave your name, address, phone number, and a brief message.

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

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
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
