Hello Everyone

Time for me to write my "Spring" letter. Really – it really is spring. Not that a person could tell from the weather as I sit here and write – but, I have faith ... spring will spring soon.

This is the time we'll be attending to outdoor type things; so, please remember that our rules require that you submit an Alteration Request (AR) and get approval before you do any work on the outside of your residence.

Plans for 2022

The Board met on Monday, April 4, to review our plans for this year.

Lampposts: If you've been reading the Newsletters, you know that we have been working on adding lampposts to the Community for quite a long time. The major problem is access to electricity; and, so, we did a test using solar lights. The solar light just didn't provide enough light to justify the cost. The contractor has advised that he is going to find a different solar lamp for us to try.

Repaving: Randy Wolfe volunteered to manage the asphalt work which was previously managed by Tom Striegel. Randy has talked with the contractor and they plan to inspect the asphalt throughout the Community and come back to the Board with recommendations.

Landscaping: John Paravati has volunteered to manage the landscaping work throughout the Community which was previously managed by Tom Striegel. The Board did approve trimming the trees along Hennig – that work has been completed. John will be bringing additional proposals to the Board.

Annual Inspection: As we have done the last couple of years, we divided the Community among Board members to inspect. Each Inspector will do inspections at his/her convenience – but, we're hoping all inspections will be done before the end of June.

We will continue to do follow-up inspections each month.

If you receive a letter, please don't ignore it. If you dispute what you are being asked to do, or if you find that you are not able to complete the maintenance work within the time specified, please let us know. If you just ignore the letter, it will ultimately lead to fines. No one wants that to happen.

Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation. Please don't hesitate to call us if you have any questions or concerns. We will be happy to work with you to get these problems resolved.

Finally ... these are my please please please reminders:

Please secure your trash – especially recyclables. I don't know why the weather gods choose Sunday nights for wind storms ... what I do know is that trash ends up all over the place. Once again, we had to hire a crew to come in and pick up trash. There goes money that could be used for something a lot more fun than trash. If trash is scattered, couldn't you pick it up? Do we really have to pay someone to come in and do that for us?




