Hope this finds you well.

What in the world is going on down on Lantern Hill Extension?

As I mentioned in our last Newsletter, two Steeplechase residents, Randy Wolfe and Ray Fabieseski, took it upon themselves to do a massive amount of clean up work.

This area, which is Steeplechase Common Ground, was basically a dump. The "dump" started when the construction crews used it to dump construction waste material. Then, other people just started throwing stuff. Obviously, this was definitely not in keeping with the way Steeplechase wants to be viewed by our residents and potential future residents.

As the project went along for the better part of two years, it reached a point that more heavy-duty equipment was needed ... dead trees had to be removed as well as the vines that were strangling all the trees. As I'm writing, Fred's Tree Service is just about finished cutting down, cutting up, and removing this debris.

On August 15, John Paravati and Randy Wolfe met with the owner of Green Leaf Landscaping to talk about leveling the area, adding top soil and planting grass.

Most likely, this will conclude the work for this year. Starting next year, we need to consider uses for the property. The area will have lovely shady areas for benches. We're also thinking we might add another Steeplechase library station down there. (Still need to talk to the Steeplechase Librarian about that.) Is there a Gazebo in our future?

If you haven't yet, you might want to drive down there and take a look. We'd love to hear your thoughts for possible uses.

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

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
