PRESIDENT'S NEWS Judi Lewis

Hello Everyone, I hope this finds everyone well and enjoying the summer.

A few things to report:

Steeplechase Board

At the end of April, Scott Hinsch advised us that he needed to resign from the Board. Scott is working full-time and then some and found he needed to eliminate a few commitments from his schedule. Scott will continue to function on the EPC and as a Hotline volunteer. He also agreed to help us out this year with our annual inspection. Scott is such a logical and practical thinker ... the Board will miss him. Scott has made so many contributions to the Community which we deeply appreciate.

The Board decided to fill Scott's position. We looked to two people who had previously expressed an interest in serving on the Board – and, luckily, one was still very much interested. We are happy to welcome Jeannine Carver to the Board. Jeannine is also a busy busy lady; but, somehow, she fits it all in. Jeannine was approved by the Board at the beginning of our meeting in May and sat with us for her first Board meeting. We are looking forward to having Jeannine with us for the long-term. Since Scott's term is up this coming November, Jeannine will be running for a new 3-year term at that time.

At the advice of our legal counsel, the Board adopted new procedures for the conduct of Board Meetings. While the procedures impose a more structured approach, we believe this will help us address Steeplechase business in a more organized manner. A copy of the new procedures is included with this Newsletter. Please notice that, if you have an issue you wish to have the Board address, you need to advise us in advance of the meeting.

Landscaping

As you know, in April, we became aware that our Landscaper from last year was unable to meet the requirements of our contract due to a labor shortage.

April is the month we normally begin the season - e.g. preparing the islands, mulching, etc. We were really in a predicament.

We reached out to Peak Landscaping. We have used Peak in the past. They know us, we know them. Of course, here it is April and Peak was not expecting to take on a client as large as Steeplechase. After discussions and meetings, Peak agreed to accept the contract – warning us, however, that the first few months were going to be "rough." Peak had to scramble to get a work crew and equipment assigned to us.

We've had some rough spots, but our grass is being cut, our islands have been mulched and weeded. Yes, we've received complaints that things are not working as smoothly as last year. John Paravati and Peak are working together as hard as they can to get us through this season. We ask for your patience.

Asphalt

Randy Wolfe met with our asphalt contractor and Mr. Dave Sylvester from CMA. The group inspected all of the asphalt in Steeplechase and is now working on a report which will be presented to the Board and the Finance Committee. As I mentioned in April, we are so excited about having this team. Having them coupled with the Finance Committee will give us exactly the planning tool we need to prepare for future major expenses from our Reserve and Replacement Fund.

Annual Inspection

We're hoping to have the inspection completed by the end of June. As I write, we're making progress.

Annual Picnic

Most likely, by the time you receive this Newsletter, the picnic will have happened. But, as I sit here today, I'm excited and looking forward to it. Special THANK YOU to Betty Long and her Social Committee for all the work putting this event together.




